Survivors shall be notified of options for changing academic and living situations.

- Accusers and accused must have the same opportunity to have others present.
- Both parties shall be informed of the outcome of any disciplinary proceedings.

The Campus Sexual Assaults Victim's Bill of Rights requires all colleges and universities (both public and private) participating in federal student aid programs afford sexual assault victims certain basic rights. The "Campus Sexual Assault Victim's Bill of Rights" exists as a part of the campus security reporting requirements, commonly known as the Jeanne Clery Act. The Violence Against Women Reauthorization Act (VAWA), signed into law March 7, 2014 imposes new obligations on colleges and universities under its Campus Sexual Violence Act ("SaVE Act") provision, Section 304.
